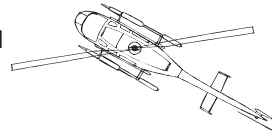


Intended Audience

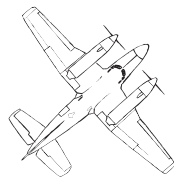
The Radisson Hotel Akron City Centre is within walking distance to the conference.


