Data Collection

Data collected in the following programs:

- National Automotive Sampling System (NASS)
 - CDS / Crashworthiness Data System
 - GES / General Estimates System
- Fatality Analysis Reporting System (FARS)
- Special Crash Investigations (SCI)



Data Collection

- CDS
 - Nationally representative sample
 - 24 sites
 - -~4,500 crashes per year
- GES
 - Nationally representative sample
 - 60 areas of the U.S.
 - -~60,000 crashes per year



Data Collection

- FARS
 - Census of Fatal Crashes
 - 50 states, District of Columbia & Puerto Rico
 - ~38,000 crashes per year
- SCI
 - Special crash circumstances
 - In-depth investigations
 - Screened by NHTSA EMS office



2009 EMS / Fire Data Changes

- · NHTSA EMS office assisted
- Definition change for "Special Use" vehicles:

Always in "special use":

- Fire Truck and Ambulance
- · Although not necessarily in emergency use
- New attribute

Emergency Services Vehicle

 Includes light vehicles authorized to respond to incidents (SUV, vans etc.)
